Executive Order No. 397.

By virtue of the powers vested in the Military Government of Santo Domingo, the following Executive Order is dictated and promulgated:

Colonel Arthur T. Marix, U. S. Marine Corps, having reported as the relief of Colonel Rufus H. Lane, U. S. Marine Corps, is hereby designated as the Officer Administering the Affairs of the Departments of Justice and Public Instruction, and Foreign Relations, beginning with the date of this Order.

Executive Order No. 398.
